SingYourJoy numbers are staying fairly consistent now (60 to 70 during intake - 50 at concert) and the chorus continues to make new friends through our networks, which helps replenish the natural attrition that we have come to expect with this cohort. The chorus has a reputation as a fun safe place of respect for all. As a result SYJ serves a diverse group of young adults including - students in secondary and post-secondary studies, some with mental health challenges, people starting their careers, the borderline homeless, the LGBTQQIP2SAA, people with physical challenges and varying abilities, people from stable and not-so-stable backgrounds.

Singers come because they love to sing. They stay and engage - in part - because they enjoy being an active part of the SingYourJoy community.

Charitable Status achieved March 2017


In March of this year, the SingYourJoy Young Adult Chorus Society was granted charitable status by the Canada Revenue Agency. Our gratitude to Treasurer Maja Kaffanke in 'stick-handling' the application once it was received by the CRA. The support of the entire Board in attending the extraordinary meeting on March 13 to approve the change in Purpose of the Society was greatly appreciated. The granting of Business Number: 849518931RR0001 will allow the Society to receive donations and issue tax receipts without involving Victoria Presbytery. This status also provides the Society the opportunity to apply for funding grants from various organizations, including the Capital Regional District (CRD), the Victoria Foundation, and others who only give consideration to groups with charitable status.

New shift in community action focus

This past year chorus members were asked to come up with initiative(s) that could become singer-driven community service. At table discussion they imagined and planned their #MentalHealthMatters awareness campaign. At the April 2017 concerts, singers shared their own stories of mental health and mental illness challenges. Other singers offered personal artwork and poetry which was made available on professionally produced "art cards", each displaying contact information for local mental health resources. These art cards were available on both concert nights, and gross donations exceeded \$400. It is our hope to encourage and grow this initiative in the coming season.



A day trip to Chemainus

On Saturday, March 25 SingYourJoy boarded a Wilson's highway coach and travelled to Chemainus for its first out-of-town ROAD TRIP! This one day excursion provided an opportunity for group bonding on the bus as well as a performance at the local United Church with proceeds going to three local charities. This also allowed the singers and directors the time to hone our songs for our April concerts. Chemainus United served as host for lunch, as well as local liaison to the charities: Rasta Animal Sanctuary; Harvest House Food Bank; Chemainus Community Refugee Sponsorship Team. We even managed a short walk-about through town to view the world famous murals, guided by Cim MacDonald the local artist now charged with restoring and maintaining the artworks.





Unified Year-Long Themes: Connections December 2016 / Relations April 2017

Building upon the starting theme of 'Connections' (our December concert at St. Aidan's United Church), our April 2017 concerts (2, in our rehearsal home of Oak Bay United), focused on 'Relations'. Our guest artists, the Coastline Fiddlers, were a wonderful match in age, energy and enthusiasm with our own singers, and the resulting concerts were a well-balanced blend, not only of music and energy, but also of cohesion with excellent scripting to continue the theme throughout the concert. Kudos to Gordon Miller for his work on the script, and to Dylyn Wilkinson for wonderful interpretations as Master of the Concert (MC).

Ivonne Hernandez, music director of Coastline, created 4 ensemble accompaniments to SingYourJoy's repertoire, and the result was a new level of music and fun for both performers and audience.









Singing in the community:

Christmas Lights Across Canada, Cridge Centre & Highgate Lodge

SingYourJoy was thrilled to participate once more at the annual Christmas Lights Across Canada event at the BC Legislature in December. The light-up happened after the December Connections concert, and included an audience carol sing-along, arranged by Gordon and Christine, and lead jointly with Daniel Lapp and the Joy of Life Choir. Due to inclement weather, the light-up happened inside the Legislature building, and was a success for all involved.

In a move away from meal preparation and serving at Our Place Society, the chorus chose to entertain at two local seniors' homes as our community service. On a Monday evening in December the chorus shared their song with residents at the Cridge Centre, delighting them with some youthful energy. In April, the chorus performed at Highgate Lodge and ended the evening with a wrap-up celebration at the nearby 1550's Restaurant. Our gratitude to Lori Downey for her work in coordinating these performances, including researching residences that would be able to accommodate 50-75% of our singers.

BCCF Chorfest 2017 participation

A major project for the co-directors since 2016 had been the creation of a new Young Adult Choir within the BC Choral Federation's annual provincial choral festival *Chorfest*. Hosted in Victoria on the 2017 May long weekend, four choirs of singers from across the province gathered to work with esteemed choral conductors, celebrating choral singing as a life-long avocation.

Ten SingYourJoy singers joined the inaugural non-auditioned BCCF Chorfest 2017 Young Adult Choir, while 2 participated in the auditioned BC Youth Choir. The weekend was a fabulous experience for all involved! The gala concert on Sunday, May 21 at University Centre Farquhar Auditorium hosted a massed choir of almost 400 singers, together with the Victoria Symphony. SingYourJoy gained provincial attention by encouraging 'our brand' of barrier-free choral singing.
